Music plays a central part in our worship services at Temple Lutheran Church, and there are many opportunities for sharing musical talent during worship. Some of Temple's musical groups are highlighted below. Additionally, throughout the year, there are numerous opportunities for volunteers to play or sing solos during worship. All you have to do is say you're interested!



Praise Band - Kenaniah

This group leads music during the 10:45 service. Rehearsals are arranged around the players' schedules. The best instruments for this group are band instruments (i.e., woodwinds and brass), drums, guitar and bass guitar, along with vocalists. It's a great way to be involved with leading worship and to gain valuable ensemble playing experience.



Handbell Choir

Rehearsals are on Tuesday evenings, from September through December; for the rest of the program year, rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings. All ages and levels welcome!

Also, anyone with an interest can check it out in Handbell Newbies - learn the basics of ringing handbells, of reading handbell music, and of playing in an ensemble. No previous experience or music-reading ability is needed.



Festival Choir

The Festival Choir sings on Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday, as well as on a few other special occasions during the year. Rehearsals are scheduled during the weeks leading up to the service(s).



Kids Choir

A great way to get kids started in music, the children sing, ring handchimes, play music games, and generally have fun learning about music. They also periodically sing in church, including weekly during Advent. Meeting times are set to accommodate the participants' schedules.
