

TODAY'S READING: EXODUS 15:1-21

¹Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD: "I will sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously: horse and rider he has thrown into the sea. ²The LORD is my strength and my might, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him. ³The LORD is a warrior; the LORD is his name. 4"Pharaoh's chariots and his army he cast into the sea; his picked officers were sunk in the Red Sea. ⁵The floods covered them; they went down into the depths like a stone. ⁶Your right hand, O LORD, glorious in power your right hand, O LORD, shattered the enemy. ⁷In the greatness of your majesty you overthrew your adversaries: you sent out your fury, it consumed them like stubble. ⁸At the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up, the floods stood up in a heap; the deeps congealed in the heart of the sea. ⁹The enemy said, 'I will pursue, I will overtake, I will divide the spoil, my desire shall have its fill of them. I will draw my sword, my hand shall destroy them.' ¹⁰You blew with your wind, the sea covered them; they sank like lead in the mighty waters. ¹¹"Who is like you, O LORD, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in splendor, doing wonders? ¹²You stretched out your right hand, the earth swallowed them. ¹³"In your steadfast love you led the people whom you redeemed: you guided them by your strength to your holy abode. ¹⁴The peoples heard, they trembled; pangs seized the inhabitants of Philistia. ¹⁵Then the chiefs of Edom were dismayed:

trembling seized the leaders of Moab;

all the inhabitants of Canaan melted away.

¹⁶Terror and dread fell upon them;

by the might of your arm, they became still as a stone until your people, O LORD, passed by,

until the people whom you acquired passed by.

¹⁷You brought them in and planted them on the mountain of your own possession,

the place, O LORD, that you made your abode,

the sanctuary, O LORD, that your hands have established.

¹⁸The LORD will reign forever and ever."

¹⁹When the horses of Pharaoh with his chariots and his chariot drivers went into the sea, the LORD brought back the waters of the sea upon them; but the Israelites walked through the sea on dry ground.

²⁰Then the prophet Miriam, Aaron's sister, took a tambourine in her hand; and all the women went out after her with tambourines and with dancing. ²¹And Miriam sang to them:

"Sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously;

horse and rider he has thrown into the sea."



Have you ever feared for your safety ... just because of who you are, just because of the color of your skin? I haven't but in the past year I've read many articles about people, right here in our corner of Pennsylvania, who frequently have that kind of fear.



The Rev. Raymond Miller, pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Hilltown and a member of the Anti-racism Team of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, wrote the following:

I did not fully comprehend the reality of "white privilege" until I had an unexpected conversation with a fellow pastoral care resident at the hospital where both of us were serving.

My friend and colleague, an African American, began the conversation by telling me about a frightening moment that he had the previous evening while driving home from the hospital. Because of road construction, he was forced to take a detour. While driving along an unfamiliar route, he came upon a police roadblock. Stopped along with other drivers, he began to pray: "Please Lord, if I have to get a beating, give me the strength to endure." My friend eventually passed through the roadblock without incident and arrived home safely. As a white person, I thought to myself, "It would have never occurred to me to be concerned about my own safety at a police roadblock. Yes, I might be annoyed at the delay but not fearful." That's when I had an awakening. I knew then that being white gives me a privilege that people of color do not have.


My friend was not looking for pity or sympathy. He was simply expressing to me the reality of the racist system with which he has lived all of his life. He opened my eyes to see the world from the perspective of people whose experience in life has been vastly different from my own. Reflecting on my friend's story, I share it as a reminder of the anti-racism work that our faith calls us to do.
