#### **TODAY'S READING ISAIAH 44:9-20**

<sup>9</sup>All who make idols are nothing, and the things they delight in do not profit; their witnesses neither see nor know. And so they will be put to shame. <sup>10</sup>Who would fashion a god or cast an image that can do no good? <sup>11</sup>Look, all its devotees shall be put to shame; the artisans too are merely human. Let them all assemble, let them stand up; they shall be terrified, they shall all be put to shame.

<sup>12</sup>The ironsmith fashions it and works it over the coals, shaping it with hammers, and forging it with his strong arm; he becomes hungry and his strength fails, he drinks no water and is faint. <sup>13</sup>The carpenter stretches a line, marks it out with a stylus, fashions it with planes, and marks it with a compass; he makes it in human form, with human beauty, to be set up in a shrine. <sup>14</sup>He cuts down cedars or chooses a holm tree or an oak and lets it grow strong among the trees of the forest. He plants a cedar and the rain nourishes it. 15Then it can be used as fuel. Part of it he takes and warms himself; he kindles a fire and bakes bread. Then he makes a god and worships it, makes it a carved image and bows down before it. <sup>16</sup>Half of it he burns in the fire; over this half he roasts meat, eats it and is satisfied. He also warms himself and says, "Ah, I am warm, I can feel the fire!" <sup>17</sup>The rest of it he makes into a god, his idol, bows down to it and worships it; he prays to it and says, "Save me, for you are my god!" <sup>18</sup>They do not know, nor do they comprehend; for their eyes are shut, so that they cannot see, and their minds as well, so that they cannot understand. <sup>19</sup>No one considers, nor is there knowledge or discernment to say, "Half of it I burned in the fire; I also baked bread on its coals, I roasted meat and have eaten. Now shall I make the rest of it an abomination? Shall I fall down before a block of wood?" <sup>20</sup>He feeds on ashes: a deluded mind has led him astray, and he cannot save himself or say, "Is not this thing in my right hand a fraud?"

#### Important VBS Information:

- August 9-13 from 9 am-12 noon
- For children ages 4 through entering 5th grade
- Children will be assigned by grade/age to a small group.
   As a small group they will travel around outside and inside for various activities.
- Any large group activities will be done outside.
- Masks should be worn at all times, except when eating and drinking. Masks will be worn by all participants, helpers, and leaders.
- In the case of inclement weather, all activities will be held inside.
- Please apply sunscreen to your child each day before they come to VBS.
- We ask that all participants bring a mask, beach towel, and reusable water bottle to use each day.

#### In-Person Worship Service Protocol - updated 7/8/2021

- 1. **In-person Attendance**: In-person worship will be conducted with the following understandings:
  - a) Attendance will be limited to 50% of occupancy (86 people)
  - b) Each service will have 3 foot distancing between families and consenting "bubbles" in 1st floor pews
  - c) The balcony will be restricted to the Director of Music Ministries and any other musicians she utilizes.
- 2. <u>Self-screening:</u> At the beginning of each service the presider will encourage participants that do not feel well to please exit the building.
- 3. **Contact Tracing**: In the event of a positive Covid test within one week of someone's attendance to a worship service, they should notify the church office so that we will help them to notify anyone with whom they were in close contact before, during, or after worship.

# 4. <u>Distancing and Face Covering for all attendees regardless of vaccination status.</u>

- a) <u>Distancing</u>: While inside the TLC building, all families and consenting "bubbles" will maintain 3 feet distance between themselves and any other family or "bubble".
- b) **Face Covering**: All participants must wear a mask covering both nose and mouth at all times while inside the TLC building, including while speaking. If you need to uncover your nose or mouth for any reason, please exit the building first.
  - i. The preacher and speakers involved in the service may remove their mask if:
    - 1. They are fully vaccinated
    - 2. They are speaking/reading from the pulpit or behind the altar
- 5. **Singing:** Vaccinated congregants may sing while masked.
- 6. **No Food or Beverages**: To avoid the need to remove masks, no food or drinks are allowed. Communion is the exception.

CHILD AND YOUTH SAFETY POLICY The Council has approved a new Child and Youth Safety Policy (CYSP). This incorporates a new process for approving adults to work with children and youth in the congregation and establishes approvals for youth volunteers. Anyone who wants to work with children and youth will need to follow this new process, which may require them to resubmit or update their clearances to the Child and Youth Safety committee. There may be new forms you need to fill out so be sure to read the instructions on the website. The directions can be found on the TLC website under the Kids-> Child and Youth Safety heading.



#### **BOOK CLUB - RESCHEDULED**

The Universal Christ: How a Forgotten Reality can Change Everything We See, Hope For, and Believe by Richard Rohr

Richard Rohr, one of the world's most influential spiritual thinkers, delivers his long-awaited book on Jesus. In this radical message of hope, Rohr shows how "Jesus" + "Christ" reveal the divine wholeness at the heart of things--and what that means for every one of us.

In his decades as a globally recognized teacher, Richard Rohr has helped hundreds of thousands realize what is at stake in matters of faith--and it is not religion as usual. Yet Fr. Rohr has never written on the most perennially talked about topic in Christianity: Jesus Christ. Most know who Jesus was, but who was Christ? Is the word simply Jesus' last name? Too often, declares Rohr, our understandings have been held captive by culture, nationalism, and Christianity itself

Drawing on history, theology, and psychology, Rohr articulates an exhilarating and ultimately more sensible view of Jesus Christ as a portrait, so to speak, of how God works. "The whole of creation is the beloved community--the child of God--not just Jesus," he writes. In a world where religion too often divides, Rohr's understanding of the Incarnation changes not just the significance of Christmas, but how we read history, relate to nature and each other, and find our highest purpose each day.

Fans of Rohr's earlier works will find here a synthesis that reveals the broadest, most hopeful vision for humanity imaginable. Newcomers will be drawn to a science-friendly spirituality that feels both modern and timeless. All will value Rohr's practical insights on mindfulness, prayer, and enlightened social action.
